Ahmed also developed a quiet computer room with several computers where clients can use some very innovative computer programs. These programs allow the clients to manipulate different pictures and sounds to create a diversity of visual and audio stimuli. They are especially beneficial for clients with autism because they allow the individual to regulate his/her own environment.
